

THURSLEY VILLAGE: THE EARLY HOME OF EDWIN LUTYENS

Wednesday, 29th June 2022 11.00 am - 2.30 pm

The month of June takes us to the village of Thursley which sits to the west of the A3 between Milford and Hindhead.

Edwin Lutyens' parents rented The Cottage in Thursley between approximately 1876 and 1915 and the young Lutyens moved there with the family when he was six years old. Ten years later he was to start his studies at The South Kensington School of Art but much of his formative years were spent here with his parents and his many siblings.

Thursley has a number of Lutyens early commissions and gives us the rare chance to view some of his early works. We shall have a guided walk around the village and the churchyard of St Michaels with its Lutyens family memorials. We shall see "Street House" formerly "The Cottage" the house staying in family occupation after Charles Lutyens' death, in 1915, when his sister Aileen continued to live there.

Also to be viewed on the walk is "The Corner". Lutyens was commissioned in 1888 at the age of 19 to convert a row of cottages to form this single residence and seven years later designed a further extension. "Prospect cottage" is one of Thursley's most delightful buildings. Formerly the Village Institute, it was designed by Lutyens and formally opened and given to the Parish Council in 1901. The Institute was disbanded in 1959 and the building converted to residential use.
